
ADOPTING THE RCM CURRICULUM



Exam Requirements

RCM Syllabi include a sequenced course of study and guidelines for preparing students for exams. Teachers can access RCM syllabi online anytime.

We encourage all teachers to prepare students for exams at regular intervals. Regular testing supports student success by:

- Providing goals to work toward
- Challenging students to practice and perform at their highest abilities
- Tracking student progress and celebrating achievement
- · Building confidence

Scheduling an In-Person Exam

- Either a parent or teacher may register a student for an exam.
 Teachers can book several students at once using the Group Bookings option in their My RCM Account.
- Exams take place up to four times per year and are scheduled on a first come, first served basis. Access the Exam Calendar to learn more and find an exam center near you.
- Current exam pricing can be found on the RCM website.



RECOGNITION OF ACHIEVEMENT

Students who succeed at music exams realize many benefits:

- They are eligible towin Gold Medals and other recognition from The Royal Conservatory.
- Achievement in RCM Certificate Program examinations is an impressive addition to any résumé, demonstrating creativity, a willingness to learn, and an ability to achieve short- and long-term goals.
- The Associate Diploma (ARCT) from the RCM is recognized internationally as one of the highest academic credentials awarded for the study of music.
- Secondary school credits from RCM Certificate Program examinations may be available in your state or province. Many Canadian high schools recognize RCM Certificate Program examinations for credit toward graduation.

REMOTE EXAMS

The RCM offers both practical (instrumental) and theory (written) exams online providing the opportunity for students to achieve their recognition remotely. The rigors of the College of Examiners remain the same for in-person, and online exams, but the format offers increased flexibility. Students can complete an exam in their own practice space, use their own instrument, and have no need to travel to a testing location. Remote Exams are not bound to any schedule, students can take an exam whenever they feel they are prepared.

There can be additional benefits to students who choose to do their exams remotely. According to research, memories are linked to the context in which they are

created, so if you study for a test in a specific room, you may perform better on that test if you take it in the same room. Learn more about this Encoding Specificity Principle as it relates to teaching music in the research portion of the RCM Teacher Portal:





Awarded to the candidate who achieves the highest mark in Canada in the ARCT Strings examination (Distinction or first class honours).

Gordon Hallett Scholarship

Awarded to the candidate who obtains the highest aggregate mark (minimum 80%) in both the written and practical ARCT Piano Teacher's examination.

Winnifred Mae Jackson Endowment

Awarded to the five candidates who achieve the highest marks in Grade 7 Piano in Edmonton and surrounding area with the condition that it is awarded to those of the five candidates who continue on to take the Grade 8 Piano examination within a specific period of time.

Simon and Emma Kruger Memorial Scholarship

Awarded to the candidate who achieves the highest mark in the Grade 10 Violin examination in Manitoba.

Annie Larson Scholarship

Awarded to the candidate who achieves the highest mark in a violin examination, Grade 8 or higher. The winner must be a resident of Saskatchewan.

Patricia McLean Memorial Scholarship

Awarded to the candidate who achieves the highest mark in the Grade 8 Piano examination in Canada.

Adelmo Melecci Scholarship

Awarded to the candidate who achieves the highest mark in Ontario in the ARCT Piano Teacher's complete practical examination.





Helen Tough Murray Scholarship

Awarded to the candidate who achieves the highest mark in the ARCT Piano Performer's examination. The recipient must be a citizen of Canada.

Doris A. Proud Memorial Scholarship

Awarded to the candidate who achieves the highest mark in piano (Grades 1 - 10), and has completed the corresponding theory corequisites (where applicable). The winner must reside in Grande Prairie. Alberta.

Kathryn Sinclair Prize

Awarded to the candidate who achieves the highest mark in the History 3 examination in Canada.

Wayne C. Vance Organ/Keyboard Award

Awarded to the student residing in Ontario with the highest mark in the highest grade in Organ. If no such candidate exists, the prize goes to the candidate residing in Canada with the highest mark in ARCT Organ. If no such candidate exists, the prize goes to the student in Ontario obtaining the highest mark in ARCT Piano (keyboard).

Charlotte Anne Walker Scholarship

Awarded to the candidate who achieves the highest mark (minimum 85%) on the Grade 10 Piano examination, and who has completed the theory co-requisites with an average of at least 75%. The candidate must reside in Elgin County, Ontario.




